#### **STARLIGHT CENTER** BY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MARCY FIELDS, LISW-S

On May 26, 2022, the Fairfield County Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Board (ADAMH) joined community leaders, stakeholders, and neighbors as ground was officially broken on the construction of the <u>STARLight Center</u>, a stabilization facility that will be located at 336 E. Locust Street in Lancaster.

The STARLight Center, the first of its kind in Fairfield County, will be able to treat eight individuals struggling with mental health issues and 12 people battling substance use disorders.

"I commend ADAMH for recognizing that healthy communities are the foundation of healthy lives and that an organization can only be as successful as the community and neighborhood in which it operates," said Lancaster Mayor David Scheffler, an event speaker. "We have seen the impact substance use and mental health issues have caused our community, and it's not something that we can ignore."

The STARLight Center will be staffed with nurse practitioners, clinicians, and counselors and will not only ensure the best in care for those in need but will also allow people the dignity and convenience of being treated in their own community, close to their families and natural supports. "When voters passed the Fairfield County ADAMH Board levy in 2019, the main reason was to provide this facility," Fairfield County Commissioner Jeff Fix said during the ceremony. "How exciting that we're here today officially starting this amazing project for our community."

"We have received overwhelming support from our community partners, including local law enforcement, local government, and our friends at Fairfield Medical Center," said ADAMH Executive Director Marcy Fields, LISW-S, who was also an event speaker.
